## Fiddle Tips by Eileen Walter - Strengthening Your Fourth Finger

If you're like most of us, your fourth finger is your weakest finger. Sometimes using your fourth finger makes more sense than playing an open string; it all depends on the situation. Sometimes you can avoid making a string change by using your fourth finger. Sometimes you will choose to use your fourth finger so you can add vibrato. Sometimes you'll need to use your fourth finger in order to execute a double stop. Here are some exercises for strengthening your fourth finger:

I. Keeping your third finger down on a string, "trill" with your fourth finger as many times as you can in one long, slow bow stroke – then move the bow in the other direction and "trill" again as many times as you can - "trill" means moving the finger on and off the string as fast as you can, so you will hear rapid reiteration of two alternating tones.


2. Play an open string, then fourth finger, then first finger, then fourth finger, then second finger, then fourth finger, then third finger, then fourth finger.............. do this exercise first with separate bow strokes and then slur all eight notes in one bow stroke.

0, 4, 1, 4, 2, 4, 3, 4 .....

Practice these exercises regularly, as many times as you can, gradually increasing your speed – and your strength! And practice on all four strings, as the angle of your finger will be slightly different on each string.
